HOVELL STREET COOTAMUNDRA REHABILITATION:

CGRC will be undertaking rehabilitation work on Hovell Street (above) in Cootamundra. The project will see the lowering of services through the road, renewal of kerb and upgraded pavement suitable for the heavy vehicle detour.

Residents & motorists should be aware that work will start in late January with the relocation of services (water & Gas). Minor disturbances to kerb side parking & utilities in early February. Followed with pavement works to start mid to late February between Sutton St (Olympic Hwy) via Campbell St up to the Cowcumbla St intersection. The project will be completed in three stages, Stage 1: Campbell St, from Sutton St to Hovell St (full road closure), Stage 2: Hovell St, from Campbell St to Cowcumbla St (north lane), Stage 3: Hovell St, from Campbell St to Cowcumbla St (South Lane). Detailed discussions will be conducted with affected businesses in the area early in the new year to manage interactions and minimise impact.

Any person may inspect the development application and documentation and make a written submission on the proposal quoting Council's file reference, DA No. 2024/150 until 5pm on Monday 20th January **2024.** All correspondence should be addressed to the General Manager of Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council and the above DA Reference number shall be included on such correspondence. If a submission is made by way of objection, the reasons for the objection must be outlined in the submission. It should be noted that information included in submissions received regarding the proposal may be used in public reports and can be accessed under the Government Information (Public Access) Act (GIPA), 2009.

Section 10.4 of the Environmental Planning Assessment Act, 1979 and the Local Government and the Planning Legislation Amendment (Political Donations) Act, 2008 requires the disclosure of any reportable political donations or gifts by a person or persons who makes a relevant planning application to Council or submission on a relevant planning application to Council.
